



About the Festival

Now in its fourth year, this young and exciting not-for-profit festival has one aim: **to promote a love of classical music by making world-class chamber music engaging, accessible** and **inclusive for the Wirral community**. To do this we present public concerts, family workshops, pop-ups and also provide music tuition at the festival's own Youth String Quartet Academy.

The festival was founded by two members of the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra: the orchestra lead violinist Thelma Handy and cellist Alex Holladay. Both are professional musicians who have played on TV, radio and have toured the world but proudly call Wirral their home. Regularly working elsewhere with artists of equal standing, they are determined to spread classical music throughout Wirral.

What's On in 2024

This summer the festival will present **7 events** between **22nd - 30th June**. It features the award-winning global folk group **Kabantu**, **The Leenhardt Harp Flute Viola Trio** and **Stravinsky's** *A Soldier's Tale*, narrated by international opera star **Jennifer Johnston**. The festival will also showcase some of **Wirral's finest composers** and bring live classical music to all ages with its **Family Show**. The next generation of Wirral talent will also take the stage with performances by **Wirral Youth Brass** and the festival's very own **Youth String Quartet Academy**. All to be held in venues across Wirral, from Wallasey to Neston, via Birkenhead and Eastham.
